Please read the following information carefully.

Targets to Achieve before entering a Field Trial

Please note that the following targets are voluntary and self-administered, and something novice handlers can strive to achieve before entering a field trial.

The Handler:

- Attends a Kennel Club seminar on J Regulation
- Helps at a Kennel Club licensed field trial on three separate occasions
- Helps on an organised shoot as a picker up for a minimum of one season

The Dog:

- Has worked on an organised shoot as a picking up dog for a minimum of one season before being entered in a field trial (training days do not qualify)
- Has no recurring eliminating faults and has had sufficient experience on live game before being entered into a field trial

Code of Best Practice for Retriever Field trial Competitions

This information is primarily for the benefit of novice handlers as a helpful guide, however current competitors should also find this information relevant when entering a Retriever trial.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Dogs entered at Kennel Club Ltd licensed Field Trials must be registered at the Kennel Club Ltd in accordance with Kennel Club Ltd Regulations for Classification and Registration B.

The Club reserves the right to refuse entries.

Entry Form: Please complete your entry form in legible block capitals. Incorrect entry forms will not be placed in the Draw.

Entry Fees: If paying by cheque, a separate cheque is required for each entry. Fees must accompany paper entries.

Ownership: Please ensure that details of ownership are correct. If the dog is owned in partnership, all owners must be named. Incorrect details could result in a Kennel Club fine. If you have applied to The Kennel Club for transfer of ownership, please write TAF (transfer applied for) after the dog's name.

Multiple Entries: Where an individual enters more than one dog in a stake, he/she must nominate his/her first choice

Stud Book Number: Please use a Stud Book number where appropriate in place of Registration number.

Ballot: If entries or nominations exceed the number of permitted runners, the right to compete shall be decided by ballot.

Draw: If you do not use e-mail, please send a self-seal stamped addressed envelope for the result of the Draw.

Return of Entry Fees: Kennel Club Ltd rule J6.f applies.

Substitution of Dogs: The Club does not permit substitution of dogs while reserves stand.

Non UK Entries: All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.

No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Kennel Club, followed by advertisement in appropriate journals if time permits before the closing of entries.

Judges at a Trial are prohibited from entering a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership.

Videography and photography will only be permitted with the express permission of the Chief Steward and the host.

All competitors and spectators attending the trial must consider themselves under the orders of the officials and must follow closely behind the flagman.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

WELFARE OF DOGS

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any field trial licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the trial.
